Quakers in Stillington

A Settled Meeting is recorded in 1669 as part of Thirsk Monthly Meeting under the name of Crayke and including Sutton, Huby, Tollerton, Tholthorpe and Stillington. Researching Quaker History – A Guide to Sources, by Helen E. Roberts, published by University of Brynmor Jones Llb. 2003 (revised 2007)

There was a Quaker Meeting House in Stillington in 1689 (1).

Viz:- In pursuance of an Act, 1689 for exempting their Majestie's Protestant subjects etc. it was certified to the Justices at these Sessions that at the several places hereafter mentioned are meeting houses for certain persons dissenting from the Church of England, called Quakers, viz:-

A list of various places, then

Stillington, Huby, Sutton, Strensall, Stitenam in Sheriffe Hutton Parish, Sherifff Hutton, Fosse House in the Parish of Sheriffe Hutton, etc.

Although it did not exist in 1743.
